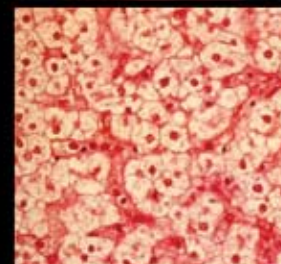
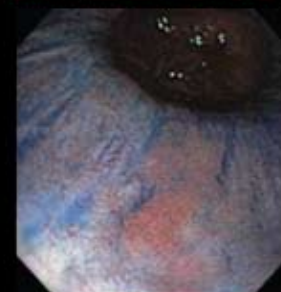
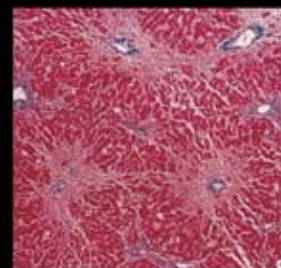
OBJECTIVES
